

DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

I Saw Water Flowing From The Temple

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

This reading from the Prophet Ezekiel tells of the streaming, healing waters that flow from the temple. These waters restore life to the river's inhabitants as well as the fruit bearing trees along its banks. It is believed that the water signifies blessings, whereas the lack of signifies trouble, hardship.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul compares us to a building whose foundation has been laid by Jesus. As the people of God, we can only be solid if we are grounded in Christ.

Gospel: John 2:13-22

Near the time of Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem and saw the temple had become a marketplace. He became angry and proceeded to drive out the vendors and livestock. Jesus spoke of destroying the temple and rebuilding it in three days. The Jews did not know Jesus was speaking of his body, but when his resurrection from the dead came to pass, his disciples remembered what Jesus had said and came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

All Souls' Intentions made in the month of November will be on the altars at each church in front of the tabernacles. Intentions may be made in the envelopes at the churches or through the Online Giving Portal.

Thoughts from Father Ruminski

Once again, we have a rare occurrence of a feast day replacing the regular Sunday Mass of this 32nd Sunday in Ordinary time. We had September 14th (the Exaltation of the Holy Cross), November 2nd (All Soul's Day) occur on Sunday. Now, we have the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. This day, a dedication of a Church in Rome, is so important that the whole world celebrates it on November 9th.



The Lateran Basilica is the shorthand nickname for a much longer title of a church building. It is the: Major Papal, Patriarchal and Roman Archbasilica, Metropolitan and Primatial Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in Lateran, Mother and Head of All Churches in Rome and in the World. As a full name, it is rather clunky, which is why it is usually shortened to "the Lateran Basilica" or "Saint John Lateran."

Its significance is great for several reasons. It is the first, public church building in Rome after Christianity was legalized. Even though it is not the original building, it is in the original place, land donated by the Laterani family (which is where the name Lateran comes from). As the first public church building, it is the cathedral – the place of authority – for the Bishop of Rome (the Pope). As the Pope's cathedral, it serves as the sign of unity for all the bishops throughout the whole world. Historically, it is where the Pope lived before the Apostolic Palace was built in the Vatican.

It is often called "John Lateran" because the basilica honors both John the Baptist and John the Evangelist. There is no person called "John Lateran" or "Saint John Lateran."

The reason why we rejoice and unite throughout the whole world to celebrate a building is that this building is a physical sign of the presence of the Church in the world. Each church building is a public sign that Christ is present here. Just as seeing the steeple of Saint Thomas the Apostle when driving down Farmington Avenue or looking over and seeing Saint Timothy's on North Main Street are a sign of comfort and pride to us as Catholics in West Hartford, so the Pope's Cathedral is a sign of the real, tangible presence of the Church in the world. Thus, we celebrate the dedication of the first, legally sanctioned church built for the worship of God in the city of Rome.

Remembrance angels

In keeping with All Souls' Day in November, the tradition of remembrance angels will be at both churches. All are welcome to write names to remember on an angel. They are available at the Welcome Desk at both churches throughout November.


The angels will be used to adorn Christmas Trees and garlands at Christmas.



What is a Basilica?

A large oblong shaped church building, having a nave, two or four aisles, one or more semi-circular vaulted apses, and a vaulted roof. It can also have an atrium, high altar and tall towers.

What is the Lateran Basilica?

Lateran Basilica

The Lateran Basilica is a church constructed by the Lateran Family, officially named Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior, St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist at the Lateran. Being the Highest ranking Catholic church, it is the Cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, with the Pope as pastor. At the dedication of the Basilica, St. John Lateran is named in honor of St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist.

PLAINVILLE PARISHIONERS PLANT A GARDEN TO SHARE, CULTIVATE COMMUNITY

uring the summer and fall seasons, Gary Vincent uses his gardening skills for the benefit of parishioners at Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Plainville.

"I'm helping the church but the parishioners mainly," he says. "I like to do things that put a smile on somebody's face."

On an acre of church grounds, Vincent keeps the "lost art" of gardening alive by (in no particular order) composting, planting, fertilizing, installing weed control fabric, trellising the tomatoes and harvesting a variety of vegetables for parishioners to enjoy.

Now that the season has come to an end, Vincent is rototilling the church garden with his tractor and harvesting the seeds. He will begin growing plants next March, utilizing his own portable greenhouse on his Plainville property.

"I look at a little seed, and I like to watch it grow," Vincent says. "I've been gardening all my life. My father taught me how to plant when I was 12, and I haven't missed a season yet."

Vincent, who has received an Archdiocese of Hartford St. Joseph Medal of Appreciation with his wife, Laurie, is a lifelong parishioner of Our Lady of Mercy Parish. He pours his heart, soul and resources into the garden.

"I like to plant what people want the most when they go to the grocery store, tomatoes," says Vincent, who is also well known for growing prize-winning pumpkins for competitions.

At the church garden last spring, he planted some 450 tomato plants consisting of a wide variety of types. Complementing the tomatoes were eggplant, zucchini, yellow squash, cucumbers, Nardello sweet frying peppers, shishito peppers and radishes, in addition to a patch of zinnia flowers.

"We plant everything about 28 to 36 inches apart for good air circulation," Vincent says. "There's a lot of tricks to the trade."

Father M. David Dawson, pastor of Our Lady of Mercy Parish, credits the parish volunteers for their commitment to the garden. "The parish garden is operated by a very small but dedicated crew of volunteers, to whom the parish is greatly indebted to for their service," he says.

"In a time where the bare necessities have gotten so very expensive, the parish is blessed to have these green thumbs helping so very many people. They produce thousands of dollars' worth of vegetables. Hopefully, we will have an influx of volunteers to continue to make it possible next spring."

Plainville resident and parishioner Leona Bisson is one of those volunteers, who started helping Vincent more five years ago. "I started talking to Gary and I wanted to help," she says. "He's a master gardener. He knows everything about growing."

Bisson even recruited her 19-year-old grandson, Ryan Whitehead, to help her pick vegetables, pack them in boxes and carry them into the church.

The boxes with vegetables are displayed on tables at the church's two entrances for the parishioners to help themselves after weekend

Bisson makes sure the boxes are refilled after every Mass. An extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, she brings fresh vegetables with her when she visits homebound parishioners. Some vegetables are also donated to the local food pantry.

"We get so excited over these vegetables, to watch them grow and to think of how many people will enjoy them," Bisson says. She adds that volunteers harvested about 10,000 tomatoes during the 2024 growing season. "People appreciate it so much."

Vincent says he finds joy in gardening. "I feel I am accomplishing something," he says.
